

## Museum/Organizations/Special Collection: Resources in Vermont



The following museums, organizations, and special collections are available to students working on History Day research. Check the websites for hours and contact information. It is always a good idea to call ahead to ensure the availability of materials and the assistance of research librarians.

The best way to find primary sources on local topics relating to a less documented event is to go to the **town clerk's office, the local library, or the local historical society** of the community in which the event occurred. You will find many important documents such as **birth certificates, marriage licenses, death records, diaries, photographs**, and other primary sources related to your topic. If your topic focuses on a more recent event, you may be able to conduct an **oral history** with someone who experienced the event.

1. **Chimney Point** (Addison) Native American, French colonial, and early American artifacts.
2. **Justin Smith Morrill Homestead** (Strafford) Household items and printed materials related to the life & career of influential Senator Justin Morrill, chief sponsor of Land Grant College Act.
3. **Mount Independence** (Orwell) Revolutionary War artifacts on site of colonial fortification.
4. **President Calvin Coolidge Historic Site** (Plymouth) Coolidge homestead, other public buildings of Plymouth Notch. Artifacts, exhibits, presentations related to life of Calvin Coolidge.
